Today's Readings

First Reading (*Amos 6:1a,4-7*)

Thus says the Lord the God of hosts: Woe to the complacent in Zion! Lying upon beds of ivory, stretched comfortably on their couches, they eat lambs taken from the flock, and calves from the stall! Improvising to the music of the harp, like David, they devise their own accompaniment. They drink wine from bowls and anoint themselves with the best oils; yet they are not made ill by the collapse of Joseph! Therefore, now they shall be the first to go into exile, and their wanton revelry shall be done away with.

Psalm (*Psalm 146:7, 8-9, 9-10*)

R. Praise the Lord, my soul!

Blessed is he who keeps faith forever, secures justice for the oppressed, gives food to the hungry. The Lord sets captives free.

R. Praise the Lord, my soul!

The Lord gives sight to the blind; the Lord raises up those who were bowed down. The Lord loves the just; the Lord protects strangers.

R. Praise the Lord, my soul!

The fatherless and the widow he sustains, but the way of the wicked he thwarts. The Lord shall reign forever; your God, O Zion, through all generations. Alleluia.

Second Reading (*1 Timothy 6:11-16*)

But you, man of God, pursue righteousness, devotion, faith, love, patience, and gentleness. Compete well for the faith.

Lay hold of eternal life, to which you were called when you made the noble confession in the presence of many witnesses. I charge you before God, who gives life to all things, and before Christ Jesus, who gave testimony under Pontius

Pilate for the noble confession, to keep the commandment without stain or reproach until the appearance of our Lord Jesus Christ that the blessed and only ruler will make manifest at the proper time, the King of kings and Lord of lords, who alone has immortality, who dwells in unapproachable light, and whom no human being has seen or can see.

To him be honor and eternal power. Amen.

Gospel (*Luke 16:19-31*)

Jesus said to the Pharisees: "There was a rich man who dressed in purple garments and fine linen and dined sumptuously each day. And lying at his door was a poor man named Lazarus, covered with sores, who would gladly have eaten his fill of the scraps that fell from the rich man's table. Dogs even used to come and lick his sores. When the poor man died, he was carried away by angels to the bosom of Abraham. The rich man also died and was buried, and from the netherworld, where he was in torment, he raised his eyes and saw Abraham far off and Lazarus at his side. And he cried out, 'Father Abraham, have pity on me. Send Lazarus to dip the tip of his finger in water and cool my tongue, for I am suffering torment in these flames.' Abraham replied, 'My child, remember that you received what was good during your lifetime while Lazarus likewise received what was bad; but now he is comforted here, whereas you are tormented.

Moreover, between us and you a great chasm is established to prevent anyone from crossing who might wish to go from our side to yours or from your side to ours.' He said, 'Then I beg you, father, send him to my father's house, for I have five brothers, so that he may warn them, lest they too come to this place of torment.' But Abraham replied, 'They have Moses and the prophets. Let them listen to them.' He said, 'Oh no, father Abraham, but if someone from the dead goes to them, they will repent.' Then Abraham said, 'If they will not listen to Moses and the prophets, neither will they be persuaded if someone should rise from the dead.'"

Gospel Reflection

The Parable of Rich Man and Lazarus digs deep into our life's values and attitudes. It communicates to us that neither is it a sin to be rich nor will being poor confirm our entry into heaven.

The rich man can be anyone. He is condemned but we do not know the reason. He has not done anything evil. He has not robbed or refused taxes. He has not ill-treated his servants or blasphemed. He is perhaps insensible to the needs of others and has committed a sin of omission. After his death, Abraham denies him to give a drop of water though not accused him of any fault. He simply reminds him that he was rich and enjoyed on earth while Lazarus suffered.

Lazarus means "the Lord helps" was at his door and his condition was inhuman. He had to content himself with the crumbs that fell from the diners table. We don't have any information on the poor man whether he had an exemplary and moral life. We only know that on earth he was poor and in heaven things were reversed.

The parable neither gives an opinion on the moral behavior of the rich and the poor nor tells us whoever behaves well goes to heaven and who does evil goes to hell because the rich did not commit sins and Lazarus didn't do anything good. Therefore, this parable has another message to convey.

Jesus condemned the rich man not because he was bad, but because he was rich, that is, he locked himself in his world and failed to share his wealth with the needy. Jesus wants his disciples understand that he is against the existence of two types of people—the rich and the poor. It is against the plan of God. Wealth is given to all and those who have more must share with those who have less or having none so that there is equality. "Our desire is not that others might be relieved while you are hard pressed, but that there might be equality. At the present time your plenty will supply what they need, so that in turn their plenty will supply what you need. The goal is equality..." (2 Cor 8:13,14). So, before anyone can enjoy the surplus, it is necessary that all must have met the most basic needs.
