The Ascension of the Savior is an integral part of our faith. As St Paul says, through the ascension of the Lord, our heart and minds are enlightened and we come to share in the riches of his glory, inherit the greatness of His power for us who believe. The ascension of the Lord enables us, as St. Augustine says, to be with Jesus because where the head is the body must also be. The Ascension of the Lord is not just the final act in the earthly ministry of Jesus Christ but it is about a new way of being here and now.

Jesus has completed the Father's mission here on earth and he now rules with all authority and intercedes with all sympathy as our mediator and high priest in the presence of the Father. Like the apostles in today's Gospel, we draw near and worship him. Precisely because of his Ascension into heaven, he is near to us. He says, "Look, I am with you always; yes, to the end of time." The ascension of Jesus does not mean the absence of Jesus: it means his presence, shown often in weakness and in what is small and despised, but backed by the infinite power and glory of God. Ascension Sunday is a kind of wake-up call. St Paul says we should lift our eyes from the worries and anxieties of this life to see Jesus seated at the right hand of the Father.

Families with vulnerable individuals are encouraged to continue to take special precautions. *All are requested to wear protective masks in the church except the children who are below two years old. If you don't have mask, we will provide. *We will maintain the social distancing of six feet in the church. * Exchanging the sign of peace will be verbal.* The communicants are requested to receive Holy Communion in their hands.* Before someone who has had virus returns to participation at mass, they should have 14 days without symptoms or 2 negative tests. * There will not be any gathering outside the church and * Use hand sanitizer provided in the church.**

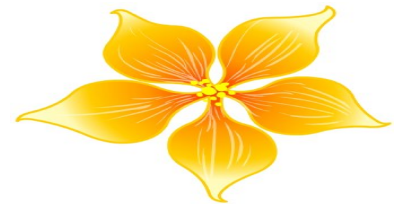

SAINT PHILIP NERI (1515-1595)

May 26

In a shop near the Vatican, a group of Americans laughed as the shopkeeper showed off his fluent English and latest souvenir, a key ring whose papal portrait, when pressed, activated a recorded blessing. Through the shop window, two clerics scowled disapproval. The shopkeeper grunted, "They're a very somber order who've left the Church. I recognize them." "By their long robes?" an American asked. "Many in Rome wear robes," replied the shopkeeper. "It's their long faces!" When Philip Neri arrived in sixteenth-century Rome, there was reason to be somber. Swiss Guards had been massacred on Saint Peter's steps defending the pope. Parts of Europe were abandoning the Church. But Philip resolved to be an "apostle of joy," drawing especially the young to Christ—and frequent confession and Communion—by his sincere interest in their problems, prayerful example, and gentle humor. His "Oratory," a movement as well as a place, provided recreation and devotion in a joyful atmosphere of companionship, service, and liturgy. Philip Neri challenges each of us to begin improving Church and world by changing ourselves with unflinching joy.
