Gospel Reflection

Today's Gospel passage describes two miracle stories, one contained within the other – a healing of a woman who was afflicted with hemorrhages for twelve years, and a restoration of life of a girl who was at the point of death. These miracles were worked by Jesus as rewards for the trusting Faith.

The woman who was suffering from incurable hemorrhage overcame two obstacles that stand in between this meeting: the fear of violating the strict Mosaic law of ritual purity (Lev 15:25-27) and the barrier formed by the huge crowd that flock around Jesus. But the woman's boldness in touching Jesus' cloak and coming in contact with the crowd -- which, according to the Law, made everyone around ritually unclean. Her fortitude and trusting faith in the healing power of Jesus was so strong that she risked breaking all the religious and social rules to seek what she believed He could do for her.

Here Jesus takes a unique approach of disregarding the law of ritual purity. He lets himself be approached and touched. That is why he calls the woman and places her in the middle, not to humiliate her, but to teach us that there is no physical or moral disease, that justifies the refusal to approach God. In the face of the Lord all people are impure, but they are made pure by their faith in Jesus Christ. Jesus responded to her faith "Daughter, your faith has saved you. Go in peace and be cured of your affliction."

In the second miracle, Jesus by raising the child from the sleep of death shows that faith in Him can also obtain this victory. But here Jesus could add a few more years to her life. At the end she too faced the reality of death as if the death has the upper hand. But Jesus defeated death by His own resurrection and ascension and extended our transformed life to eternity.

Today's Readings

First Reading *(Wisdom 1:13-15;2:23-24)*

God did not make death, nor does He rejoice in the destruction of the living. For He fashioned all things that they might have being; and the creatures of the world are wholesome, and there is not a destructive drug among them nor any domain of the netherworld on earth, for justice is undying. For God formed man to be imperishable; the image of His own nature He made him. But by the envy of the devil, death entered the world, and they who belong to His company experience.

Responsorial Psalm *(Psalm 107:23-24, 25-26, 28-29, 30-31)*

R. I will praise you, Lord, for you have rescued me.

I will extol you, for you drew me clear and did not let my enemies rejoice over me. O Lord, you brought me up from the netherworld; You preserved me from among those going down into the pit.

R. I will praise you, Lord, for you have rescued me.

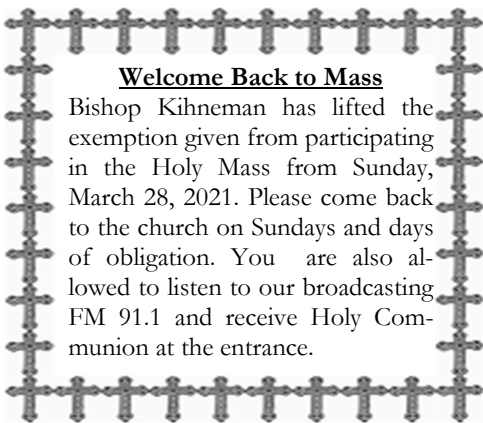
Second Reading *(2 Corinthians 8:7,9,13-15)*

Brothers and sisters: As you excel in every respect, in faith, discourse, knowledge, all earnestness, and in the love we have for you, may you excel in this gracious act also. For you know the gracious act of our Lord Jesus Christ, that though He was rich, for your sake He became poor, so that by His poverty you might become rich. Not that others should have relief while you are burdened, but that as a matter of equality Your abundance at the present time should supply their needs, so that their abundance may also supply your needs, that there may be equality. As it is written: Whoever had much did not have more, and whoever had little did not have less.

Gospel *(Mark 5:21-43 or 5:21-24, 35b-43)*

When Jesus had crossed again in the boat to the other side, a large crowd gathered around Him, and he stayed close to the sea. One of the synagogue officials, named Jairus, came forward. Seeing Him he fell at His feet and pleaded earnestly with Him, saying, "My daughter is at the point of death. Please, come lay Your hands on her that she may get well and live." He went off with him, and a large crowd followed Him and pressed upon Him.

While He was still speaking, people from the synagogue official's house arrived and said, "Your daughter has died; why trouble the teacher any longer?" Disregarding the message that was reported, Jesus said to the synagogue official, "Do not be afraid; just have faith." He did not allow anyone to accompany Him inside except Peter, James, and John, the brother of James. When they arrived at the house of the synagogue official, He caught sight of a commotion, people weeping and wailing loudly. So He went in and said to them, "Why this commotion and weeping? The child is not dead but asleep." And they ridiculed Him. Then He put them all out. He took along the child's father and mother and those who were with Him and entered the room where the child was. He took the child by the hand and said to her, "Talitha koum," which means, "Little girl, I say to you, arise!" The girl, a child of twelve, arose immediately and walked around. At that they were utterly astounded. He gave strict orders that no one should know this and said that she should be given something to eat.
