

## Gospel Reflection

In today's Gospel, the Pharisees and the Herodians ask Jesus a tricky and embarrassing question in order to trap him: "Is it lawful to pay taxes to Caesar, or not?" For the nationalistic Jews saw the payment of taxes as illegal while those who feared the Romans saw the refusal to pay taxes as inciting rebellion. So when Jesus was asked about the lawfulness of paying taxes to the Roman emperor, he was actually put into a trap. Either yes or no would make him an enemy of the Romans or of the oppressed nationalist Jews. Jesus's sharp response has the tone of righteous indignation; he perceived their malicious intent. The issue was really not payment of taxes but their hypocrisy. Jesus embarrassed and outwitted them with his answer: "repay to Caesar what belongs to Caesar and to God what belongs to God".

The first message that Jesus wants to give is clear: it is a moral duty as well as civil to contribute to the common good with the payment of tribute. There is no reason that justifies tax evasion or theft of state assets. Whatever the policy and economic choice of the government, the disciple of Christ is called to be an honest and exemplary citizen. He is actively engaged in building a just society and shuns the ploy. He makes political choices that favor the weakest, not those that safeguard their own interests

St. Paul says, "Let everyone be subject to the governing authorities, for there is no authority except that which God has established. The authorities that exist have been established by God. Consequently, whoever rebels against the authority is rebelling against what God has instituted, and those who do so will bring judgment on themselves.... Therefore, it is necessary to submit to the authorities, not only because of possible punishment but also as a matter of conscience. This is also why you pay taxes, for the authorities are God's servants, who give their full time to governing. Give to everyone what you owe them: If you owe taxes, pay taxes; if revenue, then revenue; if respect, then respect; if honor, then honor. (Rom 13:1-7).

Jesus' answer is not limited to state the duty to contribute to the common good with the payment of taxes. He adds: "repay to God what belongs to God". Creating man God said "Let us make man in our image, to our likeness. So God created man in his image, in the image of God he created him" (Gen 1:26-27). If the coin had to be "returned" to Caesar because on it was stamped the face of the emperor, man must be "returned" to God. Man is the only creature on whom the face of God is imprinted. He is sacred and no one can take possession of him/her as his/her own. Those who make them their own (enslave, oppress, exploit, dominate or use as an object..) should immediately return him/ her to the Lord.

## Today's Readings

### Entrance Chant

To you I call; for you will surely heed me, O God' turn your ear to me; hear my words. Guard me as the apple of your eye' in the shadow of your wings protect me.

### First Reading

Thus says the LORD to his anointed, Cyrus, whose right hand I grasp, subduing nations before him, and making kings run in his service, opening doors before him and leaving the gates unbarred: For the sake of Jacob, my servant, of Israel, my chosen one, I have called you by your name, giving you a title, though you knew me not. I am the LORD and there is no other, there is no God besides me. It is I who arm you, though you know me not, so that toward the rising and the setting of the sun people may know that there is none besides me. I am the LORD, there is no other.

### Responsorial Psalm

**R. Give the Lord glory and honor.**

Sing to the LORD a new song; sing to the LORD, all you lands. Tell his glory among the nations; among all peoples, his wondrous deeds.

### Second Reading

Paul, Silvanus, and Timothy to the church of the Thessalonians in God the Father and the Lord Jesus Christ: grace to you and peace. We give thanks to God always for all of you, remembering you in our prayers, unceasingly calling to mind your work of faith and labor of love and endurance in hope of our Lord Jesus Christ, before our God and Father, knowing, brothers and sisters loved by God, how you were chosen. For our gospel did not come to you in word alone, but also in power and in the Holy Spirit and with much conviction.

### Gospel

**The Pharisees went off and plotted how they might entrap Jesus in speech. They sent their disciples to him, with the Herodians, saying,**

**"Teacher, we know that you are a truthful man and that you teach the way of God in accordance with the truth. And you are not concerned with anyone's opinion, for you do not regard a person's status. Tell us, then, what is your opinion: Is it lawful to pay the census tax to Caesar or not?" Knowing their malice, Jesus said, "Why are you testing me, you hypocrites? Show me the coin that pays the census tax." Then they handed him the Roman coin. He said to them, "Whose image is this and whose inscription?" They replied, "Caesar's." At that he said to them, "Then repay to Caesar what belongs to Caesar and to God what belongs to God."**
