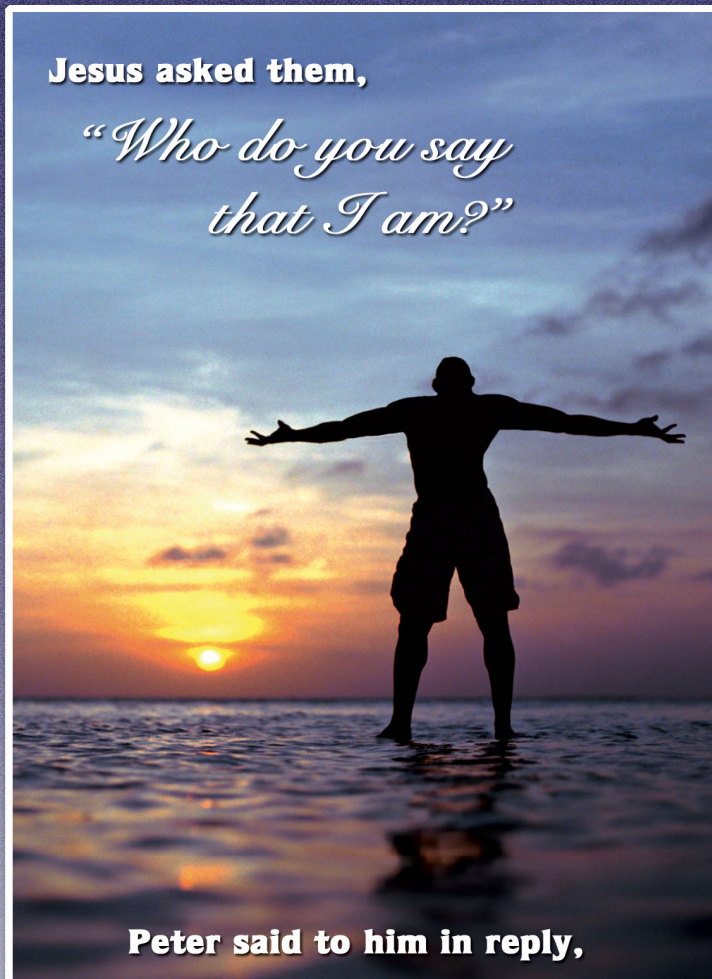

Today's Readings

First Reading (*Isaiah 50:4c-9a*)

The Lord God opens my ear that I may hear; and I have not rebelled, have not turned back. I gave my back to those who beat me, my cheeks to those who plucked my beard; my face I did not shield from buffets and spitting. The Lord God is my help, therefore I am not disgraced; I have set my face like flint, knowing that I shall not be put to shame. He is near who upholds my right; if anyone wishes to oppose me, let us appear together. Who disputes my right? Let that man confront me. See the Lord God is my help; who will prove me wrong?

Psalm (*Psalm 116:1-2, 3-4, 5-6, 8-9*)

R. I will walk before the Lord, in the land of the living.

I love the Lord because He has heard my voice in supplication, because He has inclined His ear to me the day I called..

R. I will walk before the Lord, in the land of the living

The cords of death encompassed me; the snares of the netherworld seized upon me; I fell into distress and sorrow, and I called upon the name of the Lord, "O Lord, save my life!"

Second Reading (*James 2:14-18*)

What good is it, my brothers and sisters, if someone says he has faith but does not have works? Can that faith save him? If a brother or sister has nothing to wear and has no food for the day, and one of you says to them, "Go in peace, keep warm, and eat well," but you do not give them the necessities of the body, what good is it? So also faith of itself, if it does not have works, is dead. Indeed someone might say, "You have faith and I have works." Demonstrate your faith to me without works, and I will demonstrate my faith to you from my works.

Gospel (*Mark 8:27-35*)

Jesus and His disciples set out for the villages of Caesarea Philippi. Along the way He asked His disciples, "Who do people say that I am?" They said in reply, "John the Baptist, others Elijah, still others one of the prophets." And He asked them, "But who do you say that I am?" Peter said to Him in reply, "You are the Christ." Then He warned them not to tell anyone about Him. He began to teach them that the Son of Man must suffer greatly and be rejected by the elders, the chief priests, and the scribes, and be killed, and rise after three days. He spoke this openly. Then Peter took him aside and began to rebuke Him. At this He turned around and, looking at His disciples, rebuked Peter and said, "Get behind me, Satan. You are thinking not as God does, but as human beings do." He summoned the crowd with His disciples and said to them, "Whoever wishes to come after me must deny himself, take up his cross, and follow me. For whoever wishes to save his life will lose it, but whoever loses his life for my sake and that of the gospel will save it."

Gospel Reflection

Several times in the first chapters of Mark's Gospel, we see that the crowds and the disciples ask themselves the question of "who is this?". With today's Gospel passage, Jesus begins to reveal and answer to this question. Jesus addresses to them two questions "Who do people say that I am?" and "who do you say that I am?" There were several answers for the first one but to the second one St. Peter said in reply "You are the Christ." To Peter's response follows the strict imposition of silence. Jesus does not want the news about his messianic identity be spread around because they still think that Jesus will soon establish an earthly kingdom of God on earth. Jesus wanted to correct this misconception and make very clear the goal of his journey, explaining how the Father will fulfill in him the work of salvation. Jesus begins to teach his disciples that the Son of Man must suffer many things before he succeeds to victory and now, he goes to Jerusalem not to scare off his enemies, but to give them his life. The disciples neither understand nor accept this teaching of Jesus because, it's not for this that they left the house, the boat and the family to follow the Master. Therefore, Peter took him aside and began to rebuke him. Jesus' response to Peter was tough, "Get behind me, Satan!". Jesus does not intend here "Go away!" but "Come behind him," because he was trying to guide Jesus and to put himself ahead of the Master. Jesus invites him to return to his place—behind—and to follow in his footsteps. He calls him "Satan" because, he was thinking like men, which made him blind and unable to understand the will of God. After having rebuked Peter, Jesus calls the crowd and reveals the radical nature of discipleship with three imperatives: "Deny yourself, take up your cross and follow me." The first imperative "Deny yourself" is to say, "stop thinking about oneself" We are often "self-centered" but Jesus asks us to be "other-centered" The second imperative, "take up your cross," does not refer to suffer tribulations of life because the cross was the punishment reserved for slaves, who belonged to others. To embrace cross means making the choice to become the slaves or the servants of others. Jesus wanted to become one as St. Paul says, "... he emptied himself, taking the form of a slave, being born in human likeness. Being found in appearance as a man, he humbled himself, and became obedient to death, even death on a cross." (Phil 2:7-8). Therefore, the cross is the sign of God's love and the ultimate gift of self. To carry it means to join Jesus in making oneself available to others, even to martyrdom. The third imperative, "follow me," does not mean "take Jesus as a model," but make His project yours and risk your life for love of people. "Blessed are you when people insult you and persecute you and utter all kinds of calumnies against you for my sake (Mt 5:11). So, you're going to encounter misunderstanding and rejection for the sake of God.
