## Gospel Reflection

Today, June 7 we celebrate the feast of the Most Holy Trinity. It is a fact of experience that most of us do not think often of the Trinity. We do not see the relevance of this mystery in our daily lives. Jesus Christ, Mary and some of the saints seems nearer and dearer to us and more significant for our lives than the Holy Trinity. If we are asked about the Trinity, we repeat what we learnt byheart in catechism: God is One and in this One God there are three persons: Father, Son and the Holy Spirit. There are not three gods, but one incomprehensible, eternal ineffable God. Since from our childhood we have been told that the mystery of the Trinity is the most inaccessible of all our dogmas, we do not make an effort to reflect, to pray and enter into and live our faith in the Trinity.

Yet the moment we begin thinking on our Christian lives we come to realize that the Trinity is the very foundation and goal of our lives. Baptized in the name of the Father, Son and Holy Spirit, we shall be sent forth from this world in the name of the Father our Creator, of the Son our Redeemer and of the Spirit, the Sanctifier. We begin our day in the name of the Triune God and as we retire to rest at night, we commend ourselves to the love, care and protection of the Father, Son and the Holy Spirit. Every sacrament we celebrate, every prayer we make, every meal we eat, every action we perform, begins and ends in the name and for the glory of the Trinity. "In the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit and Glory be to the Father and to the Son and to the Holy Spirit are constantly on the lips of every Christian and of the Church. "God has revealed to us three separate functions that are carried out by the Three Persons. He has told us that it is proper to attribute to God the Father the work of Creation, to God the Son the work of Redemption and to God the Holy Spirit the work of Sanctification. Our knowledge of God as Trinity is made possible *by God*, Who has chosen to reveal Himself as Father, Son and Holy Spirit. As Father, God has brought forth the created universe, including our own being. As Son, Jesus has made known a God who hears our cries, who cares, who counts the hairs on our head, and who loves us so passionately that He became one of us in order to suffer for our sins, and even to die for us. As Spirit, God remains with us and within us." (Fr. Tony)

Today, as the Church is publicly proclaiming her faith in the Triune God, we must earnestly pray for the grace that we enter into and live this faith in our daily lives. Our faith in God our Father, his Son and the Spirit must become more living, and operative in our lives.

We begin our Eucharistic celebration in the name of the Father, Son and the Spirit. In this celebration we shall in gratitude offer Jesus our Savior to the Father, the source of all love and goodness, in the power of the Spirit. United as a living community by the life-giving presence of the Spirit, we offer ourselves too in Jesus Christ to the Father. May our participation in the Eucharist which is so wholly Trinitarian, bring us closer to the living and loving God into whose community of life Jesus has introduced us.

### ***FIRST READING*** (Exodus 34:4b-6,8-9)

Early in the morning Moses went up Mount Sinai as the Lord had commanded him, taking along the two stone tablets. Having come down in a cloud, the LORD stood with Moses there and proclaimed his name, "Lord." Thus, the Lord passed before him and cried out, The Lord, the Lord, a merciful and gracious God, slow to anger and rich in kindness and fidelity". Moses at once bowed down to the ground in worship. Then he said, "If I find favor with you, O Lord, do come along in our company. This is indeed a stiff-necked people; yet pardon our wickedness and sins, and receive us as your own."
