Gospel Reflection

Gospel passage of Thirteenth Sunday (Matthew 10:37-42) concludes Jesus' great "missionary discourse" in which he instructs the twelve apostles on the cost and the reward of the commitment required of a disciple.

In the first part (vv. 37-39), details the behavior expected of his disciples in all their harshness. Radical and unprecedented renuncements are required. To make matters worse, each of them is accompanied by a severe and drastic statement, marked like a refrain, "is not worthy of me!" Above all, he demands from his disciple the radical departure even from the more intimate and natural affections, such as love for parents and for the children.

Here Jesus is not denying the Torah of Moses, which commands to honor father and mother. In fact, he has repeatedly stressed the commandment. "For God said, 'Honor your father and mother' and 'Anyone who curses their father or mother is to be put to death'" (Mt 15:4). However, he is aware that he came "for the falling and rising of many in Israel, a sign of contradiction; and a sword will pierce your own soul, so that, out of many hearts, thoughts may be revealed" (Lk 2:34-35). He knows that his word will cause misunderstandings, disagreements, and tensions within the same families.

The second half of today's Gospel speaks about the behavior expected from others towards the disciples and a promise to those who welcome the preachers of the Gospel. "Whoever welcomes you welcomes me, and whoever welcomes me welcomes him who sent me" (v. 40). This is not just material hospitality, like the one that offered by the woman to Elisha of the Old Testament (2 Kings 4:8-37) as mentioned in the reading, but the reception of the message. Those who receive Jesus receive the One who sent him. Also, those who help the "little ones," (believers) and the poor, the sick, and the needy will be adequately rewarded.

ENTERANCE CHANT: All peoples, clap your hands. Cry to God with shouts of joy!

Today's Readings

FIRST READINGS (2 Kings 4:8-11,14-16)

One day Elisha came to Shunem, where there was a woman of influence, who urged him to dine with her. Afterward, whenever he passed by, he used to stop there to dine. So she said to her husband, "I know that Elisha is a holy man of God. Since he visits us often, let us arrange a little room on the roof and furnish it for him with a bed, table, chair, and lamp, so that when he comes to us, he can stay there."

Sometime later Elisha arrived and stayed in the room overnight.

Later Elisha asked, "Can something be done for her?" His servant Gehazi answered, "Yes! She has no son, and her husband is getting on in years." Elisha said, "Call her." When the woman had been called and stood at the door, Elisha promised, "This time next year you will be fondling a baby son."

GOSPEL (Mathew 10:37-42)

Jesus said to his apostles "Whoever loves father or mother more than me is not worthy of me, and whoever loves son or daughter more than me is not worthy of me; and whoever does not take up his cross and follow after me is not worthy of me. Whoever finds his life will lose it, and whoever loses his life for my sake will find it.

"Whoever receives you receives me, and whoever receives me receives the one who sent me. Whoever receives a prophet because he is a prophet will receive a prophet's reward, and whoever receives a righteous man because he is righteous man will receive a righteous man's reward. And whoever gives only a cup of cold water to one of these little ones to drink because the little one is a disciple—amen, I say to you, he will surely not lose his reward."
