## Gospel Reflection

In today's Gospel (Mt 16: 21-27), Jesus takes his disciples by surprise when, after Peter's great confession of Faith, announces that he "must go to Jerusalem and suffer greatly from the elders, the chief priests and the scribes, and be killed and on the third day be raised." After correcting Peter's protest, Jesus announces the three conditions of Christian discipleship: "Deny yourself, take up your cross and follow me."

"What profit would there be for one to gain the whole world and forfeit his life?" these words of Jesus changed the lives of many great people, like St. Ignatius of Loyola and St. Francis Xavier. There is a proverb that says, "To gain something we have to lose something."

Our early missionaries who brought the Christian faith to many parts of the world had to forgo many of the comforts and luxuries of life in order to spread and share the faith. St. Mother Theresa left her job as a teacher of mathematics in order to take care of the poor, the needy and the marginalized. This won her the title, "Saint of the Gutters". What am I losing and what am I gaining? Am I willing to sacrifice something in order to gain what is lasting and eternal?

## Today's Readings

**Entrance Chant:** Have mercy on me, O Lord, for I cry to you all the day long. O Lord, you are good and forgiving, full of mercy to all who call to you.

### First Reading (Jeremiah 20: 7-9)

You duped me, Lord, and I let myself be duped; you were too strong for me, and you triumphed. All the day I am an object of laughter; everyone mocks me. Whenever I speak, I must cry out, violence and outrage is my message; The word of the Lord has brought me derision and reproach all the day. I say to myself; I will not mention him, I will speak in his name no more. But then it becomes like fire burning in my heart, imprisoned in my bones; I grow weary holding it in, I cannot endure it.

### Responsorial Psalm (Psalm 63:2,3-4,5-6,8-9)

### Second Reading (Romans 12:1-2)

I urge you brothers and sisters, by the mercies of God, to offer your bodies as a living sacrifice, holy and pleasing to God, your spiritual worship. Do not conform yourselves to this age but be transformed by the renewal of your mind, that you may discern what is the will of God, what is good and pleasing and perfect.

### Gospel (Matthew 16:21-27)

Jesus began to show his disciples that he must go to Jerusalem and suffer greatly from the elders, the chief priests, and the scribes, and be killed and on the third day be raised. Then Peter took him aside and began to rebuke him, "God forbid, Lord! No such thing shall ever happen to you." He turned and said to Peter, "Get behind me, Satan! You are an obstacle to me. You are thinking not as God does, but as human beings do."

Then Jesus said to his disciples, "Whoever wishes to come after me must deny himself, take up his cross, and follow me. For whoever wishes to save his life will lose it, but whoever loses his life for my sake will find it. What profit would there be for one to gain the whole world and forfeit his life? Or what can one give in exchange for his life? For the Son of Man will come with his angels in his Father's glory, and then he will repay all according to his conduct.
