Today's Readings

First Reading (*1 Kings 19:16b, 19-21*)

The Lord said to Elijah: "You shall anoint Elisha, son of Shaphat of Abel-meholah, as prophet to succeed you." Elijah set out and came upon Elisha, son of Shaphat, as he was plowing with twelve yoke of oxen; he was following the twelfth. Elijah went over to him and threw his cloak over him. Elisha left the oxen, ran after Elijah, and said, "Please, let me kiss my father and mother goodbye, and I will follow you." Elijah answered, "Go back! Have I done anything to you?" Elisha left him and, taking the yoke of oxen, slaughtered them; he used the plowing equipment for fuel to boil their flesh, and gave it to his people to eat. Then Elisha left and followed Elijah as his attendant.

Psalm (*Psalm 47:2-3,6-7,8-9*)

R. You are my inheritance, O Lord.

Keep me, O God, for in you I take refuge; I say to the Lord, "My Lord are you. O Lord, my allotted portion and my cup, you it is who hold fast my lot."

R. You are my inheritance, O Lord.

I bless the Lord who counsels me; even in the night my heart exhorts me. I set the Lord ever before me; with him at my right hand I shall not be disturbed.

R. You are my inheritance, O Lord.

Therefore my heart is glad and my soul rejoices, my body, too, abides in confidence because you will not abandon my soul to the netherworld, nor will you suffer your faithful one to undergo corruption.

R. You are my inheritance, O Lord.

You will show me the path to life, fullness of joys in your presence, the delights at your right hand forever.

Second Reading (*Galatians 5:1, 13-18*)

Brothers and sisters: For freedom Christ set us free; so stand firm and do not submit again to the yoke of slavery. For you were called for freedom, brothers and sisters. But do not use this freedom as an opportunity for the flesh; rather, serve one another through love. For the whole law is fulfilled in one statement, namely, you shall love your neighbor as yourself. But if you go on biting and devouring one another, beware that you are not consumed by one another. I say, then: live by the Spirit and you will certainly not gratify the desire of the flesh. For the flesh has desires against the Spirit, and the spirit against the flesh; these are opposed to each other, so that you may not do what you want. But if you are guided by the Spirit, you are not under the law.

Gospel (*Luke 9:51-62*)

When the days for Jesus' being taken up were fulfilled, he resolutely determined to journey to Jerusalem, and he sent messengers ahead of him. On the way they entered a Samaritan village to prepare for his reception there, but they would not welcome him because the destination of his journey was Jerusalem. When the disciples James and John saw this they asked, "Lord, do you want us to call down fire from heaven to consume them?" Jesus turned and rebuked them, and they journeyed to another village. As they were proceeding on their journey someone said to him, "I will follow you wherever you go." Jesus answered him, "Foxes have dens and birds of the sky have nests, but the Son of Man has nowhere to rest his head." And to another he said, "Follow me." But he replied, "Lord, let me go first and bury my father." But he answered him, "Let the dead bury their dead. But you, go and proclaim the kingdom of God." And another said, "I will follow you, Lord, but first let me say farewell to my family at home." To him Jesus said, "No one who sets a hand to the plow and looks to what was left behind is fit for the kingdom of God."

Gospel Reflection

Today's Gospel passage describes with the beginning of Jesus' journey from the northern towns of Galilee to the southern city of Jerusalem through the land of Samaria. Jesus encountered several problems both from the Samaritans and from the disciples, who wanted to postpone their commitment until a more convenient time. The opposition of the Samaritans represents the hostility that the Christian communities of every time must face. In the world there is always someone that stands along the way.

Jesus chose the shortcut through Samaria to go to Jerusalem. But these people on his way refused to honor Jesus as a prophet and also violated the sacred duties of hospitality. This angered the apostles and two of them, James and John, asked Jesus if he wanted them to send fire from Heaven and destroy the Samaritans as Elijah had done in his days (II Kings 1:9-12). Jesus rebuked them because he was not a destroyer but a Savior with a message of mercy and love. The only fire that can come down from heaven is the Spirit who transforms the hearts of people. This is the fire that Jesus came to bring upon the earth (Lk 12:49). The followers of Christ cannot respond with aggression, but only with love. If someone attacks them using lies, deception, violence, they can only answer by invoking upon him the blessings of God.

All the readings include four vocation stories and an exhortation on the nature of vocation.

(1) The vocation story of prophet Elisha invites us to detach ourselves from past attachments. The mention of twelve pairs of oxen shows that Elisha was rich. Elisha's action of slaughtering the bull shows a complete break from the past. His banquet to his fellow workers shows his joy in following his master.

(2) The call of three, would-be disciples of Jesus throws light on prioritizing God's call above our worldly concern. They are expected to prioritize God's call above worldly concerns, like burying their father, bidding farewell to their family and to be ready in want.

(3) St. Paul reminds us that if we are to enjoy the freedom that Christ has won for us, we need to allow ourselves to be guided by the Holy Spirit and make an effort to serve others with love.
