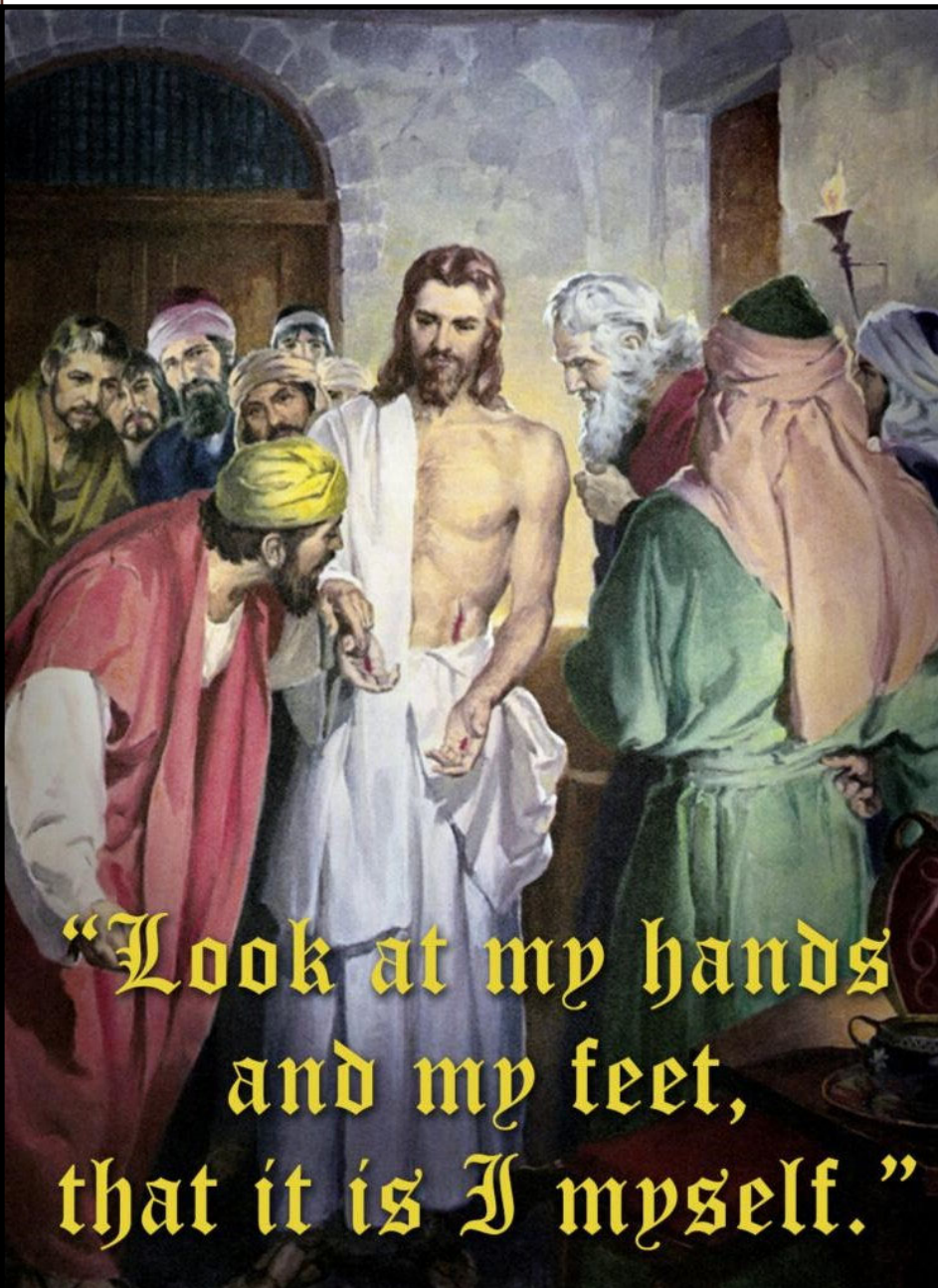

Gospel Reflection

Today's Gospel passage invites us to appreciate the riches of the Paschal mystery which is the sum total of the work of creation and redemption, of all the reality of man and of all the revelation of God. For the believer, every Eucharistic celebration renews the presence of Christ who died and rose again. Jesus comes into the midst of the Christians assembled for the Eucharistic celebration and through the Eucharist he makes them touch his body, his real presence. Christ is also present and communicates through the scriptures and through his witnesses who are sent to proclaim the forgiveness of sins.

The Risen Lord was not a ghost, but the same Jesus that the disciples had touched with their hands and with whom they had eaten. He had changed his appearance; a sublime transformation that made him unrecognizable. He was transfigured, but it was not another person. He kept his body, his ability to manifest himself outwardly, to relate, to communicate his love, but his body was different from ours, it was—as taught by St. Paul—a “spiritual” body (1 Cor 15:44).

He has a body that allows him to continue to eat and drink with us, that is, to share our hopes and delusions, our joys and sorrows. He is not out of reach, not a spirit distant and detached from our reality. Even after his return to the Father, he remains fully present and reachable to us.

The apostles, who witnessed to the Risen Lord and called the people to conversion, were themselves full of fear, doubt and hesitancy. The Lord appeared to his disciples and tried to clear away their doubt, inspire and enlighten them and lead them to understand the scriptures where everything was foretold. The Lord asked them to proclaim the Good News to all nations; the message of conversion and forgiveness of sins. The Apostles would soon begin this task very faithfully. Where ever people accept the call to conversion and where ever pardon from God and interpersonal pardon among the people take place, there the Paschal victory of Jesus bears fruit.

Today's Readings

First Reading (*Acts 3:13-15, 17-19*)

Peter said to the people: “The God of Abraham, the God of Isaac, and the God of Jacob, the God of our fathers, has glorified his servant Jesus, whom you handed over and denied in Pilate's presence when he had decided to release him. You denied the Holy and Righteous One and asked that a murderer be released to you. The author of life you put to death, but God raised him from the dead; of this we are witnesses. Now I know, brothers, that you acted out of ignorance, just as your leaders did; but God has thus brought to fulfillment what he had announced beforehand through the mouth of all the prophets, that his Christ would suffer. Repent, therefore, and be converted, that your sins may be wiped away.”

Responsorial Psalm (*4:2, 4, 7-8, 9*)

When I call, answer me, O my just God, you who relieve me when I am in distress; have pity on me, and hear my prayer!

Second Reading (*Psalms 4:2, 4, 7-8, 9*)

My children, I am writing this to you so that you may not commit sin. But if anyone does sin, we have an Advocate with the Father, Jesus Christ the righteous one. He is expiation for our sins, and not for our sins only but for those of the whole world. The way we may be sure that we know him is to keep his commandments. Those who say, “I know him,” but do not keep his commandments are liars, and the truth is not in them. But whoever keeps his word, the love of God is truly perfected in him.

Gospel (*Luke 24:35-48*)

The two disciples recounted what had taken place on the way, and how Jesus was made known to them in the breaking of bread.

While they were still speaking about this, he stood in their midst and said to them, “Peace be with you.” But they were startled and terrified and thought that they were seeing a ghost. Then he said to them, “Why are you troubled? And why do questions arise in your hearts? Look at my hands and my feet, that it is I myself. Touch me and see, because a ghost does not have flesh and bones as you can see I have.” And as he said this, he showed them his hands and his feet. While they were still incredulous for joy and were amazed, he asked them, “Have you anything here to eat?”

They gave him a piece of baked fish; he took it and ate it in front of them.

He said to them,

“These are my words that I spoke to you while I was still with you, that everything written about me in the law of Moses and in the prophets and psalms must be fulfilled.” Then he opened their minds to understand the Scriptures.

And he said to them, “Thus it is written that the Christ would suffer and rise from the dead on the third day and that repentance, for the forgiveness of sins, would be preached in his name to all the nations, beginning from Jerusalem. You are witnesses of these things.”
