## Gospel Reflection

The Feast of Christ the King celebrates Christ's kingship over the universe. The Feast is intended to proclaim Christ's kingship and supremacy over the whole world: individuals, families, society, governments, and nations. He has a legitimate, double claim to this title: as God, Christ is the creator of the universe and hence has supreme dominion over creation; as Redeemer he has shed the blood for the human race and has made us his own possession. The fact that we celebrate this feast on the last Sunday of the liturgical year, gives an eschatological dimension to it. The pilgrim Church marches towards the heavenly kingdom where Christ the king reigns in glory. And we wait for the day when we will be united with our Victorious King and share the glory of his kingdom. It is in the Eucharist we keep the memory of our Leader and King, who dies for our sins and rises to give us his new life.

The Gospel passage of the day is full of expressions that are symbolic of Christ's kingship: Jesus is the "Son of man", he "comes in his glory", he is "escorted by all the angels", his "throne of glory" signifies his royalty, taking "his seat" indicates his authority, "all nations" will stand in front of him showing his authority over all humanity, he acts as a "shepherd", he speaks to them as "king", he has God as "my Father", he is addressed as "Lord" and his function is to pronounce judgement.

Pope Pius XI who instituted the Feast of Christ the King wanted to remind all Christians that Christ must reign in their hearts, mind, will and bodies. Their allegiance must be only to Jesus their King and Lord and his teachings as compared to any other person or establishment. Since Jesus is the universal king all men and women are his subjects. He has a special concern for the poor and needy which his followers are to match. All his disciples are enjoined to look beyond themselves and move out of their personal concerns in order to serve the least, the last and the lost.

## Today's Readings

### Entrance Antiphon (Revelations 5:12; 1:6)

How worthy is the Lamb who was slain, to receive power and divinity, and wisdom and strength and hono. To him belong glory and power for ever and ever.

### First Reading (Ezekiel 34:11-12, 15-17(160a))

Thus says the Lord GOD: I myself will look after and tend my sheep. As a shepherd tends his flock when he finds himself among his scattered sheep, so will I tend my sheep. I will rescue them from every place where they were scattered when it was cloudy and dark. I myself will pasture my sheep; I myself will give them rest, says the Lord GOD. The lost I will seek out, the strayed I will bring back, the injured I will bind up, the sick I will heal, but the sleek and the strong I will destroy, shepherding them rightly.

As for you, my sheep, says the Lord GOD, I will judge between one sheep and another, between rams and goats.

### Second Reading (Corinthians 15:20-26,28)

Brothers and sisters: Christ has been raised from the dead, the first fruits of those who have fallen asleep. For since death came through man, the resurrection of the dead came also through man. For just as in Adam all die, so too in Christ shall all be brought to life, but each one in proper order: Christ the first fruits;

then, at his coming, those who belong to Christ; then comes the end, when he hands over the kingdom to his God and Father, when he has destroyed every sovereignty and every authority and power. For he must reign until he has put all his enemies under his feet. The last enemy to be destroyed is death. When everything is subjected to him, then the Son himself will also be subjected to the one who subjected everything to him, so that God may be all in all.

### Gospel (Matthew 25:31-46)

Jesus said to his disciples: "When the Son of Man comes in his glory, and all the angels with him, he will sit upon his glorious throne, and all the nations will be assembled before him. And he will separate them one from another, as a shepherd separates the sheep from the goats. He will place the sheep on his right and the goats on his left. Then the king will say to those on his right, 'Come, you who are blessed by my Father. Inherit the kingdom prepared for you from the foundation of the world. For I was hungry and you gave me food, I was thirsty and you gave me drink, a stranger and you welcomed me, naked and you clothed me, ill and you cared for me, in prison and you visited me.' Then the righteous will answer him and say 'Lord, when did we see you hungry and feed you, or thirsty and give you drink? When did we see you a stranger and welcome you, or naked and clothe you? When did we see you ill or in prison, and visit you?' And the king will say to them in reply, 'Amen, I say to you, whatever you did for one of the least brothers of mine, you did for me.' Then he will say to those on his left, 'Depart from me, you accursed, into the eternal fire prepared for the devil and his angels. For I was hungry and you gave me no food, I was thirsty and you gave me no drink, a stranger and you gave me no welcome, naked and you gave me no clothing, ill and in prison, and you did not care for me.' Then they will answer and say, 'Lord, when did we see you hungry or thirsty or a stranger or naked or ill or in prison, and not minister to your needs?' He will answer them, 'Amen, I say to you, what you did not do for one of these least ones, you did not do for me.' And these will go off to eternal punishment, but the righteous to eternal life."
