VACATION BIBLE SCHOOL 2021

Today's Readings

First Reading (*1 Kings 19:4-8*)

Elijah went a day's journey into the desert, until he came to a broom tree and sat beneath it. He prayed for death, saying: "This is enough, O Lord! Take my life, for I am no better than my fathers." He lay down and fell asleep under the broom tree, but then an angel touched him and ordered him to get up and eat. Elijah looked and there at his head was a hearth cake and a jug of water. After he ate and drank, he lay down again, but the angel of the Lord came back a second time, touched him, and ordered. "Get up and eat, else the journey will be too long for you!" He got up, ate, and drank; then strengthened by that food, he walked forty days and forty nights to the mountain of God, Horeb.

Psalm (*Psalm 34:2-3,4-5,6-7,8-9*)

R. Taste and see the goodness of the Lord

I will bless the Lord at all time; his praise shall be ever in my mouth. Let my soul glory in the Lord; the lowly will hear me and be glad.

Glorify the Lord with me, let us together extol His name. I sought the Lord, and He answered me and delivered me from all my fears.

Look to Him that you may be radiant with joy, and your faces may not blush with shame. When the afflicted man called out, the Lord heard, and from all his distress He saved him.

The angel of the Lord encamps around those who fear Him and delivers them. Taste and see how good the Lord is; blessed the man who takes refuge in Him.

R. Taste and see the goodness of the Lord

Second Reading (*Ephesians 4:30-5:2*)

Brothers and sisters: Do not grieve the Holy Spirit of God, with which you were sealed for the day of redemption. All bitterness, fury, anger, shouting and reviling must be removed from you, along with all malice. And be kind to one another, compassionate, forgiving one another as God has forgiven you in Christ. So be imitators of God, as beloved children, and live in love, as Christ loved us and handed Himself over for us a sacrificial offering to God for a fragrant aroma.

Gospel (*John 6:41-51*)

The Jews murmured about Jesus because He said, "I am the bread that came down from heaven," and they said, "Is this not Jesus, the son of Joseph? Do we not know His Father and Mother? Then how can He say, 'I have come down from heaven?'" Jesus answered and said to them, "Stop murmuring among yourselves. No one can come to Me unless the Father who sent Me draw him, and I will raise him on the last day. It is written in the prophets: *They shall all be taught by God.* Everyone who listens to my Father and learns from Him comes to Me. Not that anyone has seen the Father except the one who is from God; he has seen the Father. Amen, amen, I say to you, whoever believes has eternal life. I am the bread of life. Your ancestors ate the manna in the desert, but they died; this is the bread that comes down from heaven so that one may eat it and not die. I am the living bread that came down from heaven; whoever eats this bread will live forever; and the bread that I will give is My flesh for the life of the world."

Gospel Reflection

On this Sunday the church invites us to focus on Jesus who continues to draw us to himself so that we could be nourished and strengthened like Elijah in the desert. The first reading is a sort of encouragement for us because many of us are in the same boat. So, we can all identify with the prophet and his predicament. Unfortunately, the same Elijah who was courageous enough to face Ahab, suddenly became fearful and discouraged. However, when he thought that all hope was lost, God divinely intervened by feeding and strengthening him for his journey.

Jesus makes certain claims in today's Gospel passage: "I am the bread that came down from heaven"; "No one can come to me unless the Father who sent me draw him, and I will raise him on the last day"; "Not that anyone has seen the Father except the one who is from God"; and "whoever eats this bread will live forever". Jesus here reveals himself as God and as the "Bread of Life that came down from Heaven" for our salvation.

The Jews were convinced that they already have the "bread" that satisfies: the Torah, the word of God contained in the holy scriptures. The Jews do not need other bread and cannot admit that a man who proposes himself as the "bread of life." Because they know Jesus as the son of Joseph and his mother Mary. Therefore, how could he say that he has come from heaven?"

Jesus makes it very clear that 'No one can come to him unless drawn by the Father who sent him'. Jesus tells his listeners and us, that the discipleship is a gift from God. It is an act of God that has brought us to follow the way of Jesus. Faith is a gift. To follow Jesus is to live by Faith and Jesus offers to those people resurrection and eternal life.

This Gospel passage has no direct reference to the Holy Eucharist but the central point of it is the Eucharist as the primary source of our spiritual nourishment. Jesus knows quite well that we need both spiritual and physical food for life's journey. He offers us both.

The Bread from Heaven is also the Word of God. Moses says "Man does not live on bread alone but on every word that comes from the mouth of the Lord" (Dt 8:3). Proverb again reveals the wisdom of God: "Come, eat of the bread" (Prov 9:5).

The Bible often uses images of hunger and thirst to indicate the need for God. "My soul thirsts for God, for the living God." (Ps 42:2) and Jeremiah confessed to the Lord: "When your words came, I ate them; they were my joy and my heart's delight." (Jer 15:16).

Jesus draws us to Himself every day through the Eucharist and the Word of God in order to nourish and strengthen us for our journey to heavenly Jerusalem.
