

Today's Readings

First Reading (Isaiah 62:1-5)

For Zion's sake I will not be silent, for Jerusalem's sake I will not be quiet, until her vindication shines forth like the dawn and her victory like the dawn and her victory like a burning torch. Nations shall behold your vindication, and all the kings your glory; you shall be called by a new name pronounced by the mouth of the Lord. You shall be a glorious crown in the hand of the Lord, a royal diadem held by your God. No more shall people call you "Forsaken," or your land "Desolate," but you shall be called "My Delight," and your land "Espoused." For the Lord delights in you and makes your land his spouse. As a young man marries a virgin, your Builder shall marry you; and as a bridegroom rejoices in his bride so shall your God rejoice in you.

Psalm (Psalm 96:1-2, 2-3, 7-8, 9-10)

R. Proclaim his marvelous deeds to all the nations.

Sing to the Lord a new song; sing to the Lord, all you lands. Sing to the Lord; bless his name.

R. Proclaim his marvelous deeds to all the nations.

Announce his salvation, day after day. Tell his glory among the nations; among all peoples, his wondrous deeds.

Worship the Lord in holy attire. Tremble before him, all the earth; say among the nations: The Lord is king. He governs the people with equity.

Second Reading (1Corinthians 12:4-11)

Brothers and sisters: There are different kinds of spiritual gifts but the same Spirit; there are different forms of service but the same Lord; there are different workings but the same God who produces all of them in everyone. To each individual the manifestation of the Spirit is given for some benefit. To one is given through the Spirit the expression of wisdom; to another, the expression of knowledge according to the same Spirit; to another, faith by the same Spirit; to another, gifts of healing by the one Spirit; to another, mighty deeds; to another, prophecy; to another, discernment of spirits; to another, varieties of tongues; to another, interpretation of tongues. But one and the same Spirit produces all of these, distributing them individually to each person as he wishes.

Gospel (John 2: 1-11)

There was a wedding at Cana in Galilee, and the mother of Jesus was there. Jesus and his disciples were also invited to the wedding. When the wine ran short, the mother of Jesus said to him, "They have no wine." And Jesus said to her, "Woman, how does your concern affect me? My hour has not yet come." His mother said to the servers, "Do whatever he tells you." Now there were six stone water jars there for Jewish ceremonial washings, each holding twenty to thirty gallons. Jesus told them, "Fill the jars with water." So they filled them to the brim. Then he told them, "Draw some out now and take it to the headwaiter." So they took it. And when the headwaiter tasted the water that had become wine, without knowing where it came from —although the servers who had drawn the water knew—, the headwaiter called the bridegroom and said to him, "Everyone serves good wine first, and then when people have drunk freely, an inferior one; but you have kept the good wine until now." Jesus did this as the beginning of his signs at Cana in Galilee and so revealed his glory, and his disciples began to believe in him.

Gospel Reflection

Today we reflect on the first miracle of Jesus at Cana where He reveals his Divine power by transforming water into wine. The Bible begins with wedding of Adam and Eve in the garden (Genesis 2:23-24), and ends with the marriage supper of the Lamb (Revelation 19:9, 21:9, 22:17). In the Holy Bible, marriage is the symbol of the Covenant relationship between God, the groom and His chosen people, the bride.

In the Old Testament, God declares his love: "as a bridegroom rejoices over his bride, so will your God rejoice over you" (Is 62:5). "As a result, now I intend to allure her, lead her into the wilderness, and speak tenderly to her" ... There she will respond as she did in the days of her youth, when she came up from the land of Egypt. On that day, says the Lord, she will call me "My husband," and never again call me "My Baal." ... I will take you for my wife in fidelity, and you will know the Lord" (Hosea 2:16-18,22).

The Bible always condemns drunkenness (Pro 23:30), but wine is considered as a symbol of happiness and love (Ecclesiastes 10:19). "Wine and music gladden the heart" (Sir 40:20). A feast without wine becomes a funeral. "What is life to someone who has been deprived of wine?"—asks Sirach (31:27). "wine gladdens the heart of a man" says Psalm (Ps 104:15). "In the streets the people cry out for wine; no joy can be observed; happiness seems to have been banished from the land" (Isaiah 24:11).

At the time of Jesus, Israel was expecting the Kingdom of God as a banquet "The Lord of hosts will prepare for all peoples a feast of rich food and vintage wines, of succulent foods and well-aged wines". (Is 25:6). In fact, this kingdom seems to be far away. The people were sad, like people who celebrate a wedding feast without wine. The wedding at Cana without wine represented the sad condition of the people of Israel totally disappointed and dissatisfied.

"My hour has not yet come" because he is only at the beginning of his public ministry. The feast has just begun but will culminate when his hour will come on the Calvary. Then he will manifest all his love by giving his life for the bride from the blood and water that flow from his pierced side. In Cana, he makes only a sign of what we will do at the end of his public ministry.
