Today's Readings

First Reading (Isaiah 43:16-21)

Thus says the Lord, who opens a way in the sea and a path in the mighty waters, who leads out chariots and horsemen, a powerful army, till they lie prostrate together, never to rise, snuffed out and quenched like a wick. Remember not the events of the past, the things of long ago consider not; see, I am doing something new! Now it springs forth, do you not perceive it? In the desert I make a way in the wasteland, rivers. Wild beasts honor me, jackals and ostriches, for I put water in the desert and rivers in the wasteland for my chosen people to drink, the people whom I formed for myself, that they might announce my praise.

Psalm (Psalm 126:1-2,2-3,4-5,6)

Second Reading (Philippians 3:8-14)

Brothers and sisters: I consider everything as a loss because of the supreme good of knowing Christ Jesus my Lord. For his sake I have accepted the loss of all things and I consider them so much rubbish, that I may gain Christ and be found in him, not having any righteousness of my own based on the law but that which comes through faith in Christ, the righteousness from God, depending on faith to know him and the power of his resurrection and the sharing of his sufferings by being conformed to his death, if somehow I may attain the resurrection from the dead. It is not that I have already taken hold of it or have already attained perfect maturity, but I continue my pursuit in hope that I may possess it, since I have indeed been taken possession of by Christ Jesus. Brothers and sisters, I for my part do not consider myself to have taken possession. Just one thing forgetting what lies behind but straining forward to what lies ahead, I continue my pursuit toward the goal, the prize of God's upward calling, in Christ Jesus.

Gospel (John 8:1-11)

Jesus went to the Mount of Olives. But early in the morning he arrived again in the temple area, and all the people started coming to him, and he sat down and taught them. Then the scribes and the Pharisees brought a woman who had been caught in adultery and made her stand in the middle. They said to him, "Teacher, this woman was caught in the very act of committing adultery. Now in the law, Moses commanded us to stone such women. So what do you say?" They said this to test him, so that they could have some charge to bring against him. Jesus bent down and began to write on the ground with his finger. But when they continued asking him, he straightened up and said to them, "Let the one among you who is without sin be the first to throw a stone at her." Again he bent down and wrote on the ground. And in response they went away one by one, beginning with the elders. So he was left alone with the woman before him. Then Jesus straightened up and said to her, "Woman, where are they? Has no one condemned you?" She replied, "No one, sir." Then Jesus said, "Neither do I condemn you. Go, and from now on do not sin any more."

Gospel Reflection

The scribes and the Pharisees brought to Jesus a woman caught in adultery. They ask Jesus what he feels about executing the Mosaic punishment of stoning her to death. "If a man is found lying with the wife of another man, both of them shall die, the man who lay with the woman, and the woman; so you shall purge the evil from Israel" (Deut 22:22). According to Leviticus 20: 10 "If a man commits adultery with another man's wife—with the wife of his neighbor—both the adulterer and the adulteress are to be put to death". It is strange that the man was not also grabbed. History is repeated everywhere: aggression, violence, passion is unleashed always on the weakest; the strong always manage to get away with it.

"They said this to test him, so that they could have some charge to bring against him". Yes, Jesus always stood against these corrupt people but He has certainly the courage to defend her because He came to save the sinners. "Those who are well have no need of a physician, but those who are sick. I came not to call the righteous, but sinners" (Mk 2:17; Mt 9:13; Lu 5:32).

So, Jesus could get out of trouble in a very simple way instead He challenges them "Let anyone among you who has no sin be the first to throw a stone at her." At that point the crowd starts not to feel at home: they have been exposed. Their hypocrisy has been stripped. They move away, starting with the elders. At the end Jesus and the woman left alone.

The message we get from the Gospel passage is non condemnation. Jesus has no need to forgive the woman caught in adultery because He has not condemned her. Jesus also does not condemn the accusers of the woman. He will not even accuse or judge the very ones who have brought the woman. This is the challenge of unconditional love, to condemn no one.
