Today's Readings

First Reading (*Acts of the Apostles 1:1-11*)

In the first book, Theophilus, I dealt with all that Jesus did and taught until the day he was taken up, after giving instructions through the Holy Spirit to the apostles whom he had chosen. He presented himself alive to them by many proofs after he had suffered, appearing to them during forty days and speaking about the kingdom of God. While meeting with them, he enjoined them not to depart from Jerusalem, but to wait for “the promise of the Father about which you have heard me speak; for John baptized with water, but in a few days you will be baptized with the Holy Spirit.”

When they had gathered together they asked him, “Lord, are you at this time going to restore the kingdom to Israel?” He answered them, “It is not for you to know the times or seasons that the Father has established by his own authority. But you will receive power when the Holy Spirit comes upon you, and you will be my witnesses in Jerusalem, throughout Judea and Samaria, and to the ends of the earth.” When he had said this, as they were looking on, he was lifted up, and a cloud took him from their sight. While they were looking intently at the sky as he was going, suddenly two men dressed in white garments stood beside them. They said, “Men of Galilee, why are you standing there looking at the sky? This Jesus who has been taken up from you into heaven will return in the same way as you have seen him going into heaven.”

Psalm (*Psalm 47:2-3,6-7,8-9*)

Second Reading (*Ephesians 1:17-23*)

Brothers and sisters; May the God of our Lord Jesus Christ, the Father of glory, give you a Spirit of wisdom and revelation resulting in knowledge of him. May the eyes of your hearts be enlightened, that you may know what is the hope that belongs to his call, what are the riches of glory in his inheritance among the holy ones, and what is the surpassing greatness of his power for us who believe, in accord with the exercise of his great might: which he worked in Christ, raising authority, power, and dominion, and every name that is named not only in this age but also in the one to come. And he put all things beneath his feet and gave him as head over all things to the church, which is his body, the fullness of the one who fills all things in every way.

Gospel (*Luke 24:46-53*)

Jesus said to his disciples: “Thus it is written that the Christ would suffer and rise from dead on the third day and that repentance, for the forgiveness of sins, would be preached in his name to all the nations, beginning from Jerusalem. You are witnesses of these things. And behold I am sending the promise of my Father upon you; but stay in the city until you are clothed with power from on high.” Then he led them out as far as Bethany, raised his hand, and blessed them. As he blessed them he parted from them and was taken up to heaven. They did him homage and then returned to Jerusalem with great joy, and they were continually in the temple praising God.

Gospel Reflection

The Ascension of the Savior is an integral part of our faith. As St Paul says, through the ascension of the Lord, our hearts and minds are enlightened and we come to share in the riches of his glory and inherit the greatness of His power for us who believe. The ascension of the Lord enables us, as St. Augustine says, to be with Jesus because where the head is the body must also be. The Ascension of the Lord is not just the final act in the earthly ministry of Jesus Christ but it is about a new way of being here and now. Jesus has completed the Father's mission here on earth and he now rules with all authority and intercedes with all sympathy as our mediator and high priest in the presence of the Father.

‘In person of Jesus, the human and the Divine are united and became one at incarnation- the Word became flesh. At the Ascension, this human being with a transformed body became for all eternity. It was not the Spirit of Jesus that ascended to the Father but the Risen, transformed and living Body of Jesus: a Body that the disciples had touched, a Body in which He Himself had eaten and drunk with them both before and after His Resurrection, a real, physical but gloriously restored Body, bearing the marks of nails and spear. This is what, and Who, ascended’.

The Risen Lord announced “... repentance for the forgiveness of sins, would be preached in his name to all the nations, beginning from Jerusalem.” The prophecy of Isaiah is fulfilled “I will make you a light to the nations so that my salvation may reach to the ends of the earth” (Is 49:6). According to the prophet, it is the duty of the Messiah to bring salvation to all nations.

Before entering the glory of the Father, Jesus blesses the disciple. His blessings accompany the community of his disciples and it is the promise and guarantee of the full success of the work, which is about to begin. The final appeal could only be to rejoice: the disciples “returned to Jerusalem with great joy”. The reason why the disciples rejoice, despite not having the Master visibly present with them, is that he is with the Father and with them always “I am with you always, even to the end of this world” (Mt 28:20).

The obligation to personally participate in Holy Mass resumes for all in our diocese who are able to be physically present and can do so without gravely endangering their health.
