Today's Readings

First Reading (2 Samuel 5:1-3)

In those days, all the tribes of Israel came to David in Hebron and said: "Here we are, your bone and your flesh. In days past, when Saul was our king, it was you who led the Israelites out and brought them back. And the Lord said to you, 'You shall shepherd my people Israel and shall be commander of Israel.'" When all the elders of Israel came to David in Hebron, King David made an agreement with them there before the Lord, and they anointed him king of Israel.

Psalm (122:1-2, 3-4, 4-5)

R. Let us go rejoicing to the house of the Lord.

I rejoiced because they said to me, "We will go up to the house of the Lord." And now we have set foot within your gates, O Jerusalem.

R. Let us go rejoicing to the house of the Lord.

Jerusalem, built as a city with compact unity. To it the tribes go up, the tribes of the Lord.

R. Let us go rejoicing to the house of the Lord.

According to the decree for Israel, to give thanks to the name of the Lord. In it are set up judgment seats, seats for the house of David.

R. Let us go rejoicing to the house of the Lord.

Second Reading (Colossians 1:12-20)

Brothers and sisters: Let us give thanks to the Father, who has made you fit to share in the inheritance of the holy ones in light. He delivered us from the power of darkness and transferred us to the kingdom of his beloved Son, in whom we have redemption, the forgiveness of sins. He is the image of the invisible God, the firstborn of all creation. For in him were created all things in heaven and on earth, the visible and the invisible, whether thrones or dominions or principalities or powers; all things were created through him and for him. He is before all things, and in him all things hold together. He is the head of the body, the church. He is the beginning, the firstborn from the dead, that in all things he himself might be preeminent. For in him all the fullness was pleased to dwell, and through him to reconcile all things for him, making peace by the blood of his cross through him, whether those on earth or those in heaven.

Gospel (Luke 23:35-43)

The rulers sneered at Jesus and said, "He saved others, let him save himself if he is the chosen one, the Christ of God." Even the soldiers jeered at him. As they approached to offer him wine they called out, "If you are King of the Jews, save yourself." Above him there was an inscription that read, "This is the King of the Jews." Now one of the criminals hanging there reviled Jesus, saying, "Are you not the Christ? Save yourself and us." The other, however, rebuking him, said in reply, "Have you no fear of God, for you are subject to the same condemnation? And indeed, we have been condemned justly, for the sentence we received corresponds to our crimes, but this man has done nothing criminal." Then he said, "Jesus, remember me when you come into your kingdom.:" He replied to him, "Amen, I say to you, today you will be with me in Paradise."

Gospel Reflection

Today we celebrate the **Feast of Christ the King**. We honor Christ as our King. This feast is intended to proclaim Christ's kingship and supremacy over the whole world: individuals, families, societies, governments and nations. He has a double claim to this title: God and Redeemer. As God, Christ is the creator of the universe and hence has supreme dominion over the creation and as Redeemer he has offered himself as sacrifice for the atonement of the sin of the humanity to redeem them from eternal punishment.

Since we celebrate it on the last Sunday of the liturgical year, it gives us an eschatological dimension. The pilgrim church marches towards the heavenly kingdom where Christ, the King reigns in glory. We live in an age of democracy where kings have no role to play except in some cases, as nominal head. Jesus' kingship is different. We focus on the supreme power of Christ based on love and service. "For even the Son of Man did not come to be served, but to serve, and to give his life as a ransom for many" (Mk 10:45). Jesus earned his kingdom in a hard way: through self-emptying himself by becoming a humble and obedient servant of his father and of his people. A leader is the one who leads from the front and not from the back.

"For to us a child is born, to us a son is given, and the government will be on his shoulders. And he will be called Wonderful Counselor, Mighty God, Everlasting Father, Prince of Peace. Of the greatness of his government and peace there will be no end. He will reign on David's throne and over his kingdom, establishing and upholding it with justice and righteousness from that time on and forever" (Is 9: 6-7). "The angel Gabriel announced, you will conceive and give birth to a son, and you are to call him Jesus. He will be great and will be called the Son of the Most High. The Lord God will give him the throne of his father David, and he will reign over Jacob's descendants forever; his kingdom will never end" (Lu 1:31-33).

Jesus established his kingdom by lying down his life. Though He had power to destroy his enemies, he prayed for them, asking the father to forgive them. His is a kingdom of peace, love and joy. He laid down his life for each one of us, for the whole world. The rulers made fun of Him and the soldiers ridiculed Him, for He could not save Himself. Yet He did not utter a word against them. He bore everything patiently for saving us and the whole human race from sins. We have two options: to hurl insults at Christ the King, like the first criminal and be lost, or accept Him as your Lord and Savior and be with Him in Paradise, in his Kingdom. The choice is ours.
