Today's Readings

First Reading (*Habakkuk 1:2-3; 2:2-4*)

How long, O LORD? I cry for help but you do not listen! I cry out to you, "Violence!" but you do not intervene. Why do you let me see ruin; why must I look at misery? Destruction and violence are before me; there is strife, and clamorous discord. Then the LORD answered me and said: Write down the vision clearly upon the tablets, so that one can read it readily. For the vision still has its time, presses on to fulfillment, and will not disappoint; if it delays, wait for it, it will surely come, it will not be late. The rash one has no integrity; but the just one, because of his faith, shall live.

Psalm (*Psalm 95:1-2,6-7,8-9*)

R. If today you hear his voice, harden not your hearts.

Come, let us sing joyfully to the Lord; let us acclaim the Rock of our salvation. Let us come into his presence with thanksgiving; let us joyfully sing psalms to him.

R. If today you hear his voice, harden not your hearts.

Come, let us bow down in worship; let us kneel before the Lord who made us. For he is our God, and we are the people he shepherds the flock he guides.

R. If today you hear his voice, harden not your hearts.

Oh, that today you would hear his voice: "Harden not your hearts as at Meribah, as in the day of Massah in the desert, where your fathers tempted me; they tested me though they had seen my works."

Second Reading (*2 Timothy 1:6-8, 13-14*)

Beloved: I remind you, to stir into flame the gift of God that you have through the imposition of my hands. For God did not give us a spirit of cowardice but rather of power and love and self-control. So do not be ashamed of your testimony to our Lord, nor of me, a prisoner for his sake; but bear your share of hardship for the gospel for the strength that comes from God. Take as your norm the sound words that you heard from me, in the faith and love that are in Christ Jesus. Guard this rich trust with the help of the Holy Spirit that dwells within us.

Gospel (*Luke 17:5-10*)

The apostles said to the Lord, "Increase our faith." The Lord replied, "If you have faith the size of a mustard seed, you would say to this mulberry tree, 'Be uprooted and planted in the sea,' and it would obey you. "Who among you would say to your servant who has just come in from plowing or tending sheep in the field, 'Come here immediately and take your place at table?' Would he not rather say to him, 'Prepare something for me to eat. Put on your apron and wait on me while I eat and drink. You may eat and drink when I am finished?' Is he grateful to that servant because he did what was commanded? So should it be with you. When you have done all you have been commanded, say, 'We are unprofitable servants; we have done what we were obliged to do.'"

Gospel Reflection

Today's Gospel passage has two parts. The first part speaks about faith and the second a parable of master-servant relationship. The apostles asked Jesus to increase their faith. Is it possible for faith to grow? In reality, faith not only affects the mind and heart but it is a concrete choice. It implies a total and unconditional trust in God. Therefore, faith can grow or diminish because at times our faith journey in following our God is faster, at times less and at times one may get tired, slows down and stops.

We also understand the context in which they asked to increase their faith. Jesus had proposed the difficulty that awaits them: they have to enter through the narrow gate (Lk 13:24). They have to be ready to "hate" their father and mother (Lk 14:26) and they had to renounce all their goods (Lk 14:33). Before such demands, it is understandable that they feel the lack of faith to follow their master.

The miracles Jesus speaks of are the possible changes that could be realized in those who believe. They are the incomprehensible transformations, absolutely unforeseen, but can be realized in our society and in the world when we really trust the word of the God and put it into practice. Some examples can give light to us. The conversion of St. Paul, The conversion and disintegration of The United Socialist Soviet Republic (U.S.S.R) to 15 republics, the unification of Germany and so on. Jesus says that for one who believes has no permanent situation. Those who trust in his word will be witnessing extraordinary and unexpected miracles as the prophets announced "the desert will bloom" (Is 32:15) and the valleys will be transformed into a Garden of Eden (Is 51:3).

This affirmation is followed by a parable. It tells of a servant who, after a hard day's work, returns home very tired. The master, instead of complimenting him for the service done behaves harshly: "Prepare something for me to eat". It may surprise us because Jesus also told "Blessed are those servants whom the master finds vigilant on his arrival. Amen, I say to you, he will gird himself, have them recline at table, and proceed to wait on them". (Lk 12:37).

Jesus does not intend to confront the problem of slavery. He only makes use of an example to convey his message. He wanted to correct the misunderstanding of Pharisees about their relationship with God. We have to place this parable in the cultural context of that time when a slave was considered as property of the owner and he could not make any claim.

The pharisees used to preach a religion of merit. They were saying at the end of life, God will reward based on the performance of each one. Jesus wants the disciple not to have this type of attitude but an unconditional and gratuitous love as the Father in heaven, only enters the Kingdom of God.
