Today's Readings

First Reading (*Jeremiah 17:5-8*)

Thus says the Lord: Cursed is the one who trusts in human beings, who seeks his strength in flesh, whose heart turns away from the Lord. He is like a barren bush in the desert that enjoys no change of season, but stands in a lava waste, a salt and empty earth. Blessed is the one who trusts in the Lord, whose hope is the Lord. He is like a tree planted beside the waters that stretches out its roots to the stream: it fears not the heat when it comes, in the year of drought it shows no distress, but still bears fruit.

Psalm (*Psalms 1:1-2,3,4,6*)

R. Blessed are they who hope in the Lord.

Blessed the man who follows not the counsel of the wicked, nor walks in the way of sinners, nor sits in the company of the insolent, but delights in the law of the Lord and meditates on his law day and night.

R. Blessed are they who hope in the Lord.

He is like a tree planted near running water, that yields its fruit in due season, and whose leaves never fade. Whatever he does, prospers.

R. Blessed are they who hope in the Lord.

Not so the wicked, not so; they are like chaff which the wind drives away. For the Lord watches over the way of the just, but the way of the wicked vanishes.

R. Blessed are they who hope in the Lord.

Second Reading (*1 Corinthians 15:12, 16-20*)

Brothers and sisters: If Christ is preached as raised from the dead, how can some among you say there is no resurrection of the dead? If the dead are not raised, neither has Christ been raised, and if Christ has not been raised, your faith is vain; you are still in your sins. Then those who have fallen asleep in Christ have perished. If for this life only we have hoped in Christ, we are the most pitiable people of all. But now Christ has been raised from the dead, the first fruits of those who have fallen asleep.

Gospel (*Luke 6:17, 20-26*)

Jesus came down with the Twelve and stood on a stretch of level ground with a great crowd of his disciples and a large number of the people from all Judea and Jerusalem and the coastal region of Tyre and Sidon. And raising his eyes toward his disciples he said: **“Blessed are you who are poor, for the kingdom of God is yours. Blessed are you who are now hungry, for you will be satisfied. Blessed are you who are now weeping, for you will laugh. Blessed are you when people hate you, and when they exclude and insult you, and denounce your name as evil on account of the Son of Man. Rejoice and leap for joy on that day! Behold, your reward will be great in heaven. For their ancestors treated the prophets in the same way. But woe to you who are rich, for you have received your consolation. Woe to you who are filled now, for you will be hungry. Woe to you who laugh now, for you will grieve and weep. Woe to you when all speak well of you, for their ancestors treated the false prophets in this way.”**

Gospel Reflection

Today we reflect on “Beatitude” which means “blessedness”. True blessedness comes when we accept God as our Father and all people as children of a loving Father

In Matthew’s Gospel, Jesus proclaims eight Beatitudes sitting on top of a mountain, whereas in St. Luke’s Gospel Jesus says them on a level place and presents only four blessings along with four woes.

When St. Matthew tried to present the Beatitudes in spiritual terms like “Blessed are the poor in spirit, for theirs is the kingdom of heaven. Blessed are those who mourn, for they will be comforted”; St. Luke presents the beatitudes in earthly terms. He says: “Blessed are you who are poor, for yours is the kingdom of God. Blessed are you who hunger now, for you will be satisfied”. It is more real and worldly”.

Jesus spent the whole night in prayer on the mountain and when morning came, he chose twelve apostles. After coming down from the mountain, he addressed these Beatitudes and woes to his apostles. “Looking at his disciples, he said: “Blessed are you who are poor, for yours is the kingdom of God...” (Lu 6:20). Jesus addressed his apostles and later the Christian community as poor because what we have seen in Simon, James and John are that they left everything to follow Jesus; “So they pulled their boats up on shore, left everything and followed him” (Luke 5:11). Later in the same chapter, again we see when Levi was called, he too left everything. “... and Levi got up, left everything and followed him” (Luke 5:28). Because we hold the teachings of our master Jesus “...those of you who do not give up everything you have cannot be my disciples” (Luke 13:33). “Do not lay up for yourselves treasures on earth, where moth and rust destroy and where thieves break in and steal, but lay up for yourselves treasures in heaven... For where your treasure is, there your heart will be also” Mt 6:19-21. “No one can serve two masters, for either he will hate the one and love the other, or he will be devoted to the one and despise the other. You cannot serve God and money” Mt 6:24. Jesus is not against wealth but the way we possess and use it. It is in accumulating and not in sharing that matters.

Real hunger is the result sharing everything for the benefit of others but they will be blessed at the end. Blessed are those who are now weeping, for God will comfort them and transform their cry into joy because the Psalmist says “Those who go out weeping, carrying seed to sow, will return with songs of joy, carrying sheaves with them (Ps 126:6). The persecution Jesus mentioned is not the current one but, in the future, they are going to face. Persecution will once end; the eternal happiness and peace begins. Persecution is a proof of their discipleship. The four woes are the reaffirmation of the four beatitudes mentioned above.
