Gospel Reflection

Today's readings invite us to become aware of the power of God at work in our life besides challenging us to deepen our faith. In the Gospel the disciples experience a manifestation of God's presence and mighty power like Elijah in the first reading. As the boat is being tossed about by the terrible storm, the disciples see Jesus walking on the water. They are so frightened that they think it is a ghost. The wind calms down when Jesus gets into the boat after pulling Peter out of the water. The disciples realize that they are in the presence of the Almighty and worship Jesus saying, "Truly you are the Son of God". The presence of God is manifested in many ways in our lives, usually in ways and times that we least expect. Sometimes we survive an accident and then realize that it has been God's protective hand that has saved us. Sometimes God hits us hard to get our attention. At another times, His voice is tiny whispering sound of our conscience that moves us into action. Our God in His deepest love and compassion for us keeps looking for ways and moments to show his care and love for us. Today, let us open our eyes to see His presence, open our minds to believe His words and open our hearts to experience His love.

Today's Readings

Entrance Chant: Look to your covenant, O Lord, and forget not the life of your poor ones forever. Arise, O God, and defend your cause, and forget not the cries of those who seek you.

The First Reading (1Kings 19:9a, 11-13a)

At the mountain of God, Horeb, Elijah came to a cave, where he took shelter. Then the Lord said to him, go outside and stand on the mountain before the Lord; the Lord will be passing by. A strong and heavy wind was rending the mountains and crushing rocks before the Lord—but the Lord was not in the wind. After the wind, there was an earthquake—but the Lord was not in the earthquake. After the earthquake, there was fire—but the Lord was not in the fire. After the fire, there was a tiny whispering sound. When he heard this, Elijah hid his face in his cloak and went and stood at the entrance of the cave.

Responsorial Psalm (Psalm 85: 9,10,11-12,13-14)

I will hear what God proclaims; the Lord- for he proclaims peace. Near indeed is his salvation to those who fear him, Glory dwelling in our land.

Second Reading (Romans 9: 1-5)

Brothers and Sisters: I speak the truth in Christ, I do not lie; my conscience joins with the Holy Spirit in bearing me witness that I have great sorrow and constant anguish in my heart. For I could wish that I myself were accursed and cut off from Christ for the sake of my own people, my kindred according to the flesh. They are Israelites; theirs the adoption, the glory, the covenants, the giving of the law, the worship, and the promises; theirs the patriarchs, and from them, according to the flesh, is the Christ, who is over all. God blessed forever. Amen.

Gospel (Matthew 14:22-33)

After he had fed the people, Jesus made the disciples get into a boat and precede him to the other side, while he dismissed the crowds. After doing so, he went up on the mountain by himself to pray. When it was evening, he was there alone. Meanwhile the boat, already a few miles offshore, was being tossed about by the waves, for the wind was against it. During the fourth watch of the night, he came toward them, walking on the sea. When the disciples saw him walking on the sea, they were terrified. "It is a ghost," they said, and they cried out in fear. At once Jesus spoke to them, "Take courage, it is I; do not be afraid." Peter said to him in reply, "Lord, if it is you, command me to come to you on the water." He said, "Come." Peter got out of the boat and began to walk on the water toward Jesus. But when he saw how strong the wind was he became frightened; and, beginning to sink, he cried out, "Lord, save me!" Immediately Jesus stretched out his hand and caught Peter, and said to him, "O you of little faith, why did you doubt?" After they got into the boat, the wind died down. Those who were in the boat did him homage, saying, "Truly, you are the Son of God."
