Gospel Reflection

Today is Divine Mercy Sunday. Each year we celebrate it on second Sunday of Easter. The readings of this Sunday are about God's mercy, the necessity for trusting Faith and the need for God's forgiveness of sins. The opening prayer addresses the Father as "God of Mercy."

John's Gospel from the beginning to the end reveals the gradual faith formation of his disciples. It is in fact the itinerary of faith of his disciples. At the beginning of the gospel, the first two apostles: John (?) and Andrew come to Jesus calling him Rabbi (Teacher) (Jn 1:38). Within a few hours Andrew could figure out the identity of Jesus and said to his brother Simon: "We have found the Messiah" (Jn 1:41). Later Nathaniel recognizes Jesus as the Son of God" (Jn 1:49). The Samaritans recognize him as the Savior of the world (Jn 4:43), the people acknowledge him as the prophet (Jn 6:14), the blind man proclaims him as the Lord (Jn 9:38) and for Pilate he is the King of the Jews (Jn 19:19).

In the same way the Risen Jesus revealed the glory of his resurrection to his disciples over a period of time. Even after the apostles saw the empty tomb and heard the reports of Jesus' appearance to women, they were still weak in faith and fearful of being arrested by the Jewish authorities. When Jesus appeared to them, he offered proofs of his resurrection by showing them the wounds of his passion, his pierced hands and side from which flowed the grace of divine mercy. He calmed their fears and brought them peace, the peace which reconciles sinners and makes one a friend of a merciful God.

At the end, it is St. Thomas who says the last word about the identity of Jesus as Lord and God; the real profession of faith. Therefore St. Thomas is the first one to recognize the divinity of Christ, the first who comes to understand what Jesus meant when he said: "I and the Father are one" (Jn 10:30). Now the Lord offers each one of us new life in his Holy Spirit that we may know him personally, experience his mercy and walk in this new way of life through the power of his resurrection.

Today's Readings

First Reading *(Acts 4:32-35 (44B))*

The community of believers was of one heart and mind, and no one claimed that any of his possessions was his own, but they had everything in common. With great power the apostles bore witness to the resurrection of the Lord Jesus, and great favor was accorded them all. There was no needy person among them, for those who owned property or houses would sell them, bring the proceeds of the sale, and put them at the feet of the apostles, and they were distributed to each according to need.

Responsorial Psalm *(Psalm 118:2-4, 13-15, 22-24)*

R. Give thanks to the Lord for he is good, his love is everlasting.

Let the house of Israel say, "His mercy endures forever." Let the house of Aaron say, "His mercy endures forever." Let those who fear the LORD say, "His mercy endures forever.

The stone which the builders rejected has become the cornerstone. By the LORD has this been done; it is wonderful in our eyes. This is the day the LORD has made; let us be glad and rejoice in it.

Second Reading *(1 John 5:1-6)*

Beloved: Everyone who believes that Jesus is the Christ is begotten by God, and everyone who loves the Father loves also the one begotten by him. In this way we know that we love the children of God when we love God and obey his commandments. For the love of God is this, that we keep his commandments. And his commandments are not burdensome, for whoever is begotten by God conquers the world. And the victory that conquers the world is our faith. Who indeed is the victor over the world but the one who believes that Jesus is the Son of God? This is the one who came through water and blood, Jesus Christ, not by water alone, but by water and blood. The Spirit is the one that testifies, and the Spirit is truth.

Gospel *(John 20:29)*

On the evening of that first day of the week, when the doors were locked, where the disciples were, for fear of the Jews, Jesus came and stood in their midst and said to them, "Peace be with you." When he had said this, he showed them his hands and his side. The disciples rejoiced when they saw the Lord. Jesus said to them again, "Peace be with you. As the Father has sent me, so I send you." And when he had said this, he breathed on them and said to them, "Receive the Holy Spirit. Whose sins you forgive are forgiven them, and whose sins you retain are retained."

Thomas, called Didymus, one of the Twelve, was not with them when Jesus came. So the other disciples said to him, "We have seen the Lord." But he said to them, "Unless I see the mark of the nails in his hands and put my finger into the nailmarks and put my hand into his side, I will not believe."

Now a week later his disciples were again inside and Thomas was with them. Jesus came, although the doors were locked, and stood in their midst and said, "Peace be with you." Then he said to Thomas, "Put your finger here and see my hands, and bring your hand and put it into my side, and do not be unbelieving, but believe." Thomas answered and said to him, "My Lord and my God!" Jesus said to him, "Have you come to believe because you have seen me? Blessed are those who have not seen and have believed."

Now Jesus did many other signs in the presence of his disciples that are not written in this book. But these are written that you may come to believe that Jesus is the Christ, the Son of God, and that through this belief you may have life in his name
